### **ADMISSIONS**

Admission to the First Year B Tech. was made directly on the basis of the results of the Intermediate, Pre-University, Higher Secondary/Senior Cambridge examinations. The interviews for admission were held from the 9th to the 13th July, 1959.

A total of 1,995 applications for admission were received. Interview cards were sent to 484 candidates, of whom 468 attended the interview and 120 were given admission.

### ACADEMIC SESSION

The Academic Session for the year 1959-60 commenced on the 22nd July, 1959 and ended on the 7th May, 1960. The Institute classes and Workshop Practice were conducted in the A. C. College of Technology, the Highways Workshops, by courtesy of the University of Madras and the Government of Madras respectively.

### **EXAMINATION RESULTS**

Out of a total number of 120 students admitted to the I B. Tech. at the beginning of the Academic Session, 119 took the annual examination. Of this, 107 were promoted, 6 of them getting I class and 101 getting III class. Sri S. S. Randawa secured the I rank.

The remaining 12 students were detained, out of which 1 discontinued his studies.
