The Academic Council met on eleven occasions during the period under report.

ADMISSIONS

Admission to the first year of the B. Tech. Course was made on the basis of the results of the Intermediate/Pre-University/Higher Secondary and Senior Cambridge Examinations. In addition limited admission direct to the II year of the Five Year Integrated Course was offered to B. Sc. graduates with I or II Class with Physics or Mathematics as principal subjects as also to the Pre-Engineering students with a first class.

The interviews for admission to the I & II years were spread over from the 7th to the 9th, 26th to the 28th of July and the 17th of August, 1960.

A total of 1,993 and 384 applications were received for admission to the I year and II year respectively. Interview cards were sent to 373 candidates for the I year 79 candidates for the II year, out of whom admission was offered to 120 and 19 candidates respectively.

ACADEMIC SESSION

The Academic session for the year 1960-61 commenced on the 11th of July, 1960 and ended on the 28th of May, 1961.

The classes and workshop practice continued to be held in the A. C. College of Technology and the Highways Workshops by the kind courtesy of the University of Madras and the Government of Madras respectively, till the middle of the Academic year, when instructional work, except in the Workshops and the Chemistry laboratory, was shifted to the new buildings in the Institute Campus.

EXAMINATION RESULTS

The I.B. Tech. Classes commenced with 131 students (including detained students) on rolls.

At the end of the Academic year, 129 students in the I B. Tech. class and 121 students in the II B. Tech. class took the annual examination, and out of this number 112 students were promoted from the I year to the II year and 108 from the II year to the III year. There were 5 first-classes and 107 second-classes in the I B. Tech., and 7 first classes and 101 second classes in the II B. Tech. A total of 17 students in the I B. Tech. and 13 students in the II B. Tech. were detained and out of these, 7 in the I year and 2 in the II year discontinued their studies.
